Reporting Sonographer, Radiology

Are you looking for a role that makes the most of your skills balanced with working within a small, close-knit community?
Do you want to take that next step in your career while enjoying a healthy work/life balance?

We have an excellent opportunity for independent reporting sonographer to perform examinations to a very high standard, formulating stand-alone, concise and accurate reports.

Based primarily within the Radiology department at the Princess Elizabeth Hospital you will independently undertake and report all examinations that you are competent in, for example obstetric scanning including first trimester screening, dating scans with Nuchal Translucency accreditation, anomaly and high risk obstetric scans, abdominal, small parts, renal, gynaecological, transvaginal, paediatric, neonatal hips, neonatal heads, DVT's and preferably also carotid Doppler examination. In addition you will be required to also rotate to the neighbouring island to run an independent ultrasound service at the Mignot Memorial hospital, Alderney.

Your natural ability to communicate highly complex, sensitive or contentious results to the appropriate clinician(s) and to patients directly will be essential as will be the need to, at times, provide patients or relatives with empathy and emotional support for the bereaved, terminally ill, injured and traumatised.

You must be state registered (HCPC) if holding the professional title 'radiographer' and possess specialist knowledge and expertise through comprehensive accredited theoretical & practical training at Masters Level (i.e., DMU, Postgraduate Diploma (Pg Dip) or equivalent M-level qualification in Medical Ultrasound).

There is a high degree of autonomy within the limitations of personal expertise and skills and to take a lead in specified areas of delegated responsibility within the Ultrasound department and Department of Clinical Imaging (for example Ultrasound paediatric hip scanning in association with Southampton paediatric and local physiotherapy services).

Guernsey is the second largest of the Channel Islands, covering an area of 30 square miles and with a population of 65,000. It has some of Britain's finest and best-kept [beaches](#), an especially mild and sunny [climate](#), and the historic town of St. Peter Port, which boasts the title of the prettiest harbour town in Europe.
