


Examples of MHRA Reportable Incidents [3]

Incidents that result in or might result in harm to the patient or the users of the equipment:

- Adverse Incidents
 - Burns and overheating
 - Projectile incidents
 - Change of device function as a result of MR exposure
 - Mechanical failures
 - Cryogen and quench issues
 - Contrast injector failures
 - Noise issues
- Major artefacts
- Defective medicines
- Adverse drug reactions
