BAME OBSERVER TO UK COUNCIL

JOB DESCRIPTION

Overview

To attend meetings of the UK Council of the Society of Radiographers (SoR) in order to provide independent objective views representing the interests of BAME members of the SoR that will inform the activities, policies and strategy of the SoR.

Detailed activities

An individual who is a member of the SoR in good standing and its Equalise Network, will be appointed as an observer to the UK Council of the SoR, in order:

- To attend 6 UK Council meetings per year held at Society of Radiographers headquarters in Bermondsey, London.
- To provide a BAME perspective to the discussions and deliberations of Council
- To take part, occasionally, with officers and members of the SoR in external meetings and events
- To advise, on request, officers of the SoR to inform their work in advising policy and strategy to Council
- To attend the SoR Equalise Network meetings.
- To receive communication by email and via the internet for consideration prior to meetings.
- To take part in electronic discussion from time to time as required.

Other information

- Term of office will be 2 years
- Re-appointment is possible, for one further term.
- Appointment is at the discretion of the Equalise Network
- An induction to the work of the Society and College of Radiographers and specifically to the UK Council will be provided
- The points of contact with the organisation for the BAME observer will be the Chair of Council, the President and the CEO
- The Chair of Council and the President have authority to restrict some Council business for discussion by elected Council members only. The BAME observer, in common with other observers and with employees normally present at meetings, may be excluded from these discussions.
- Expenses for travel to meetings will be paid by the SoR in accordance with policy.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

The BAME observer should

- Be a qualified radiographer
- Be a member of the SoR
- Be a member of the SoR's Equalise Network and be able to act as a conduit for the views of the BAME members of this network and the wider membership
- Be willing to engage with and contribute to all discussions in the council chamber
- Be able to commit time to prepare for and attend meetings and to respond to electronic communications in interim periods.
